the World: Dancing Trolls

You will need:

This week's Understanding of

• clear fizzy lemonade e.g. 7-up, sprite raisins for trolls

- 1. Fill a glass with the fizzy drink.
- 2. Drop raisin -trolls in to the glass. What happens? Do they sink or float?

Then sit and watch what happens. You may need to be patient. It can take a minute or two for them to start moving.

What do you think is helping the raisins trolls to float to the top? Why do they then sink back down? Hint: what's happening to the bubbles that surround the raisins?


You will need:

- A rectangle of fabric from an old t-shirt or other scrap fabric
- Glue or sticky tape
- Some scrunched up old newspaper
- Googly eyes or circles of white paper for the eyes
- A pom pom or a button for the nose
- An elastic band
- Scraps of wool or fabric for the troll's hair

Method:

- 1. Lay your fabric on the table
- 2. Scrunch up the newspaper and put it on the long side of the fabric; wrap it over and fasten it loosely with the elastic band.
- 3. Tie a knot on each corner of your fabric for the arms and legs
- 4. Decorate your troll's head with eyes and a nose
- 5. Create your own troll hairstyle

One of you already had the idea to charge money




for breakfast! Have a look at the photo. Use real 1p coins or cut out the coins below. Make your own price tags copying the ones below and keep prices below 10p. Now charge your family for their items! They must pay in 1p coins. How much money did you make altogether?

Now allow them to buy 2 items. Add up the total cost. Count on to add (eg 5+3...I know this is 5, so count on: 6, 7, 8.)

Number track to 20

Do you remember your number cards? Muddle them up then put them in order again on the floor. Recite the numbers as you look at them from 0 to 20. Then from 20 back to 0. Ask an adult to pick a number – what is one more than that number? What is one less? Challenge: what is two more and two less?






Phonics -

choose one of the sounds and work through the activities in that column. Try to choose the one which is new for you unless you feel you need to practise an old one.



Revise all phonemes. Use your favourite small figure to jump on your phonics mat that we printed out for you. Use a timer to see how fast you can remember them. Parents, make a note of any that need more practice.





Practise writing words in a shallow dish of salt, dry lentils, flour or anything else you might have.



Say the word out loud for you child and use phoneme fingers to segment. Here are some examples of words to spell:

- nk 'I think I stink'
- Handwrite: 'n down nobby, up and over his net; k down the kangaroo's body, draw a belly button, then a tail and leg'.

Practise reading the nk sound in the story about this pink pig




The pink pig is in the junk yard.

The pink pig is sinking.




The dog sees the pink pig sinking into the mud. Quick, help the pink pig!




The kind dog helps the pink pig.

"Thank you," said the pink pig.




The dog sniffs the pink pig and said with a wink, "I think you stink!"


