LO: To use some of the ideas of artists studied to create pieces

Yayoi Kusama is a Japanese artist who was born in 1929. Much of her work is a display in which audiences can go into a space and experience her love of polka dots, colour, mirrors and shape. In the work you can see here on the right, Love Is Calling (2013), she has used mirrors to make it seem like the room goes on forever.

Yayoi Kusama began **painting** when she was ten and loved **painting** dots using **watercolours**, **pastels** and **oil**. Even though her parents didn't approve of her wanting to create art, she persuaded them to let her study at Art school. She moved to New York in the 1950s and went on to create lots of dotty work. She would never **draft** or **plan** her work, but just let her mind and her hands go on a creative journey.

Have a go at creating your own dotty picture – use anything you have at home (paints, pens, pencils, crayons, pastels... or all of them!). You could even trying printing circles or dots using the objects around you.
