## LO: To use some of the ideas of artists studied to create pieces

## Can you see anything hidden in this picture by Frank Bowling?

Frank Bowling is an artist born in 1934 in Guyana, He moved to England when he was 19 and began painting in London in the 1960s. When he moved to New York City in 1966, he became fascinated with how he could splash, drip, spill, smudge and drag paint to create different effects.

As well as experimenting with colours and how to apply paints, he liked to 'hide' real objects or shapes of maps within his work. In the painting above, you can see the shape of Africa, and maps like this were included in his work to show places of significance to Frank. The picture to the left has lots of objects actually placed on the canvas and then painted over, such as glitter, jewellery, oyster shells and toys. There's even a drawing from his son under there. He wanted to include these things as they were important to him, but he didn't mind if we weren't able to see them.

Have a go at creating your own Frank Bowling-style paint experiment piece of art. Try and use different colours of paint and different methods of spreading them on the paper splashing, scraping, spraying, spilling, dragging, anything you can think of! You could collect things from a walk or your garden, like pine cones, twigs and leaves, and use these within your work - you can try and 'hide' them under the paint or use them to paint with! Just have a go and try things you haven't tried before.
