#### **Understanding of the World:**



### Maths:

So we are ready for Reception, keep practising...

- -counting to 10, maybe going up stairs or counting songs!
- -being able to count objects correctly, placing one finger on each object and giving it one number name.
- -remembering how many objects you counted at the end, when someone says how many? You know and don't need to recount.
- -recognising some shapes and using them to build various constructions -using mathematical language, including positional such as, under, over, next to, inside, on top etc.
