## What does the Moon look like?

Up in space, far higher than any plane can go, is the Moon.



The Moon is the shape of a ball.  
It has light patches – big hills – and dark patches – huge craters.  
The craters were formed by space objects hitting the Moon at high speed.

## What does the Moon do?

- The Moon orbits the Earth every 27.3 days. The same side always faces us, so we do not see the far side.
- It shines with reflected light from the Sun.
- It makes tides in the Earth's seas.



### Moon fact

The Moon's diameter is about 3475 kilometres.



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## Is there life on the Moon?

There is no air on the Moon and there is no life. Astronauts who visit the Moon must take air with them in tanks.



an astronaut on the Moon

### Moon fact

The Moon is about 384,400 kilometres from Earth.

There is no air, but there is water – ice has been found at the north and south poles.

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

### Who has landed on the Moon?

Brave astronauts have made visits to the Moon six times.

No other place in space has been landed on by humans.

In 1969, American astronauts named Armstrong and Aldrin became the first humans to set foot on the Moon. They landed in the lunar module of Apollo 11.

The date of the last Moon landing was December 1972.
