






Biff, Chip, Wilf and Wilma went to Holly Blue Fen Nature Reserve.



Wilma wanted to see the orchids. "I'll show you one later," said Sally.






The children counted butterflies. They ticked the list each time they saw one.

They raced after the man. "Don't let him get away!" yelled Wilf.






The children raced as fast as they could.

The man stopped. "What's going on?" he asked.



"Sorry, Alex," said Chip. "We thought you were the orchid thief."






