Look at the activities and choose the one that is best for you.



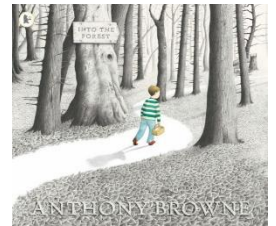
Red hot is for people who want extra challenge.

Mild is good for children who need to build confidence, or have no one to help.

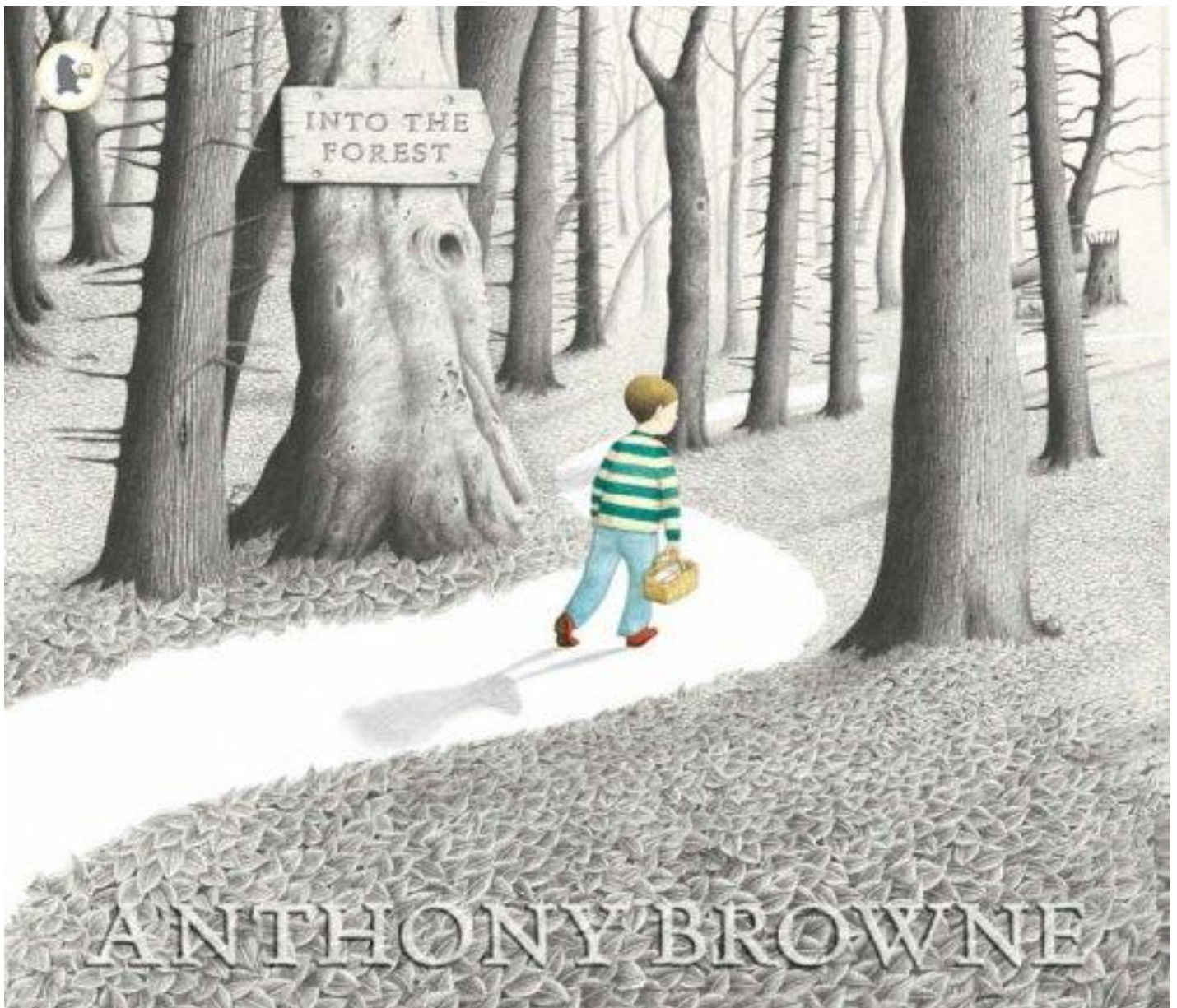
