RECAP: Give yourself a minute to name as many countries in Europe as you can remember. **Hint:** there are four countries that make up the UK alone




Brasilia is the **capital city** of **Brazil**, a country in the continent of South America. **London** is the **capital city** of **England**, a country in the continent of Europe.


Human geography relates to places and buildings around us that are **made by humans**, for example; shops, farms, ports and towns. **Physical geography** is the study of the Earth's **natural features**, such as mountains, rivers, deserts and oceans.

Brazil is the largest country in South America (in the Southern Hemisphere).


Brasília is the capital city of Brazil.




England is the largest country in the UK.

London is the capital city of England.







Brasília has a **tropical** climate, with two main seasons: a rainy season, from October to April, and a dry season, from May to September.

Temperatures are high, above 18 degrees Celsius all year round and there can be large amounts of rainfall because of the humid conditions.



London has a **temperate** climate, this means that temperatures are variable all year round but temperatures are not extremely hot or cold. The weather in London is changeable. In general, London has warm summers and cool winters. July is normally the warmest month.







Brasília has a range of different transport methods:

- A large airport, the third busiest in the whole of Brazil.
- A range of taxis.
- An underground railway named 'the Metro'.
- · A high speed railway.
- A main bus network.





London has a range of different transport methods:

- Six large airports such as London Heathrow (the busiest in the world for international traffic).
- One of the largest bus networks in the world, running 24 hours a day with over 9,000 buses.
- An underground railway named the London Underground or the Tube.
- A large railway network (366 railway stations in London).
- · Many motorways and ring roads.
- Some port and river boats.





Housing in Brasília is very expensive. However, for many years people have moved to Brasília from the countryside and smaller towns for work.

Brasília has many tall blocks of flats or apartments.





Living in the centre of London is very expensive.

There are many different types of houses and homes in London as it is such a big city.

You can find:

- apartments
- flats
- terraced houses
- detached houses
- · house boats









Brasília has busy shopping areas, offices and factories.

There are cafes and fast food outlets as well as supermarkets and department stores.

Brasília was one of the host cities for the World Cup in 2014.



London is well known for being a popular city for shopping, with many large department stores and smaller 'unique' shops.

London has many areas for business and industry with offices and factories.

There are cafes, restaurants and fast food outlets as well as many big brand supermarkets.

London was chosen to hold the 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

London is one of the most popular place in the world for tourists. Tourists visit for many of the attractions and landmarks that London has.








A major feature of the city is Lake Paranoá (although it is man-made) and also the large areas of open space and greenery.
