

#### Model:





When the time is quarter past, the long minute hand always points to 3.

The **shorter hour hand** points <u>just past</u> the hour showing what time it is.


For example: The minute hand is at 3 and the hour hand is just past 7 so; It is quarter past 7.



When the time is quarter to, the long minute hand always points to 9.

The **shorter hour hand** points to <u>just</u> before the hour showing what time it is.

For example: The minute hand is at 9 and the hour hand is just before 2 so; It is quarter to 2.
