










What is the difference between human and physical geography?

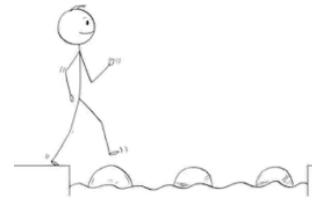

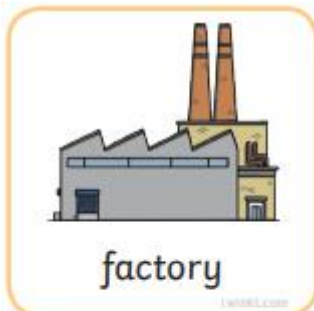
- Give some examples of both human and physical geography in your answer.
