

Success Criteria:


- 1. Read the extract from the text or ask an adult to read it to you.

- 3. Draw a picture of what you think might happen next and label it with key words.














Challenge: Write a full sentence to explain what your prediction is.





- 3. Draw a picture of your prediction and annotate it with notes to explain what is happening (look at mine below).





Challenge: finish the sentence using your prediction.
