Let's find out what Mr and Mrs Grinling ended up doing to stop those greedy seagulls!














While he waited for his lunch down in the lighthouse on the rocks. Mr Grinling sang snatches of old sea shanties as he surveyed the coastline through his telescope...








This week we are going to think about sequencing and re-writing the story.

Who are the main characters?	-Live in a cottage on a cliff,
Where is it set?	opposite a lighthouse.
Build up What happens next? How does the story hint at a problem?	·Mrs Grinling sends Mr Grinling's lunch on a wire. ·Lots of seagulls around.
Problem What is the problem within the story?	Seagulls are stealing the lunch and Mr Grinling is going without his lunch.
Resolution How is this problem resolved/ sorted out?	Mrs Grinling makes mustard sandwiches and the seagulls leave the lunch alone because they taste disgusting.
Ending How does the story end? Does it end happily? Is there a twist to the plot?	·Mr Grinling can finally enjoy his delicious lunch in peace.
