spellings **description**

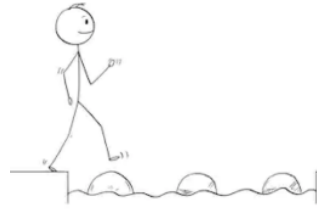
exciting opening **adjectives**
