

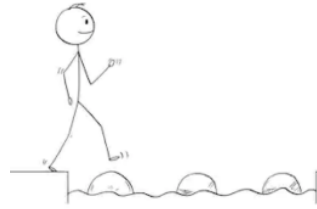
Happy Thursday Athena and Odysseus!
