Questions:

- Questions ask something.
- They start with a capital letter and finish with a question mark.
- They can be answered.
- They include a question word e.g. what, where, how, when, why, which, who, does, is, should...

How much is it? 


What is behind the sofa? 


When does the film finish? 


How do you like your eggs in the morning? 


Command:

- A command is an order – giving someone an instruction or telling them to do something.
- It usually begins with an imperative bossy verb e.g. get, do, switch, tidy...
- It can be negative e.g. 'Don't stop!'
- It can end with either a full stop or an exclamation mark.

Get in the bath. 

Eat your sprouts. 

Get out of here! 

Take off your shoes and place them under the bench. 

Remember- a statement explains a fact or an opinion like...

The children are playing.

I like icecream.
