



The Ancient Egyptians worshipped thousands of different gods and goddesses, which were often shown as humans with animal features. The gods controlled everything from the movement of the Sun across the sky to the flooding of the River Nile, the afterlife, and childbirth. Each city and village had a special patron (or guardian) god or goddess. Different gods and goddesses were thought to be more powerful at different times as Egyptian customs changed. Some gods took on completely different forms over the centuries.
