LO: To use imperative verbs



A **verb** is the **action** in a sentence.

Imperative verbs can be called bossy verbs.

They come at the front of a sentence and turn it into an instruction or command.

Example: Fold the paper carefully into exactly equal halves.

The instruction is very clear, so the reader knows exactly what to do.
