Task (with links):

Read and/or listen to Rachel reading the next part of Charlotte's Web (pp.3-12):

Write a character description of Fern based on what you learn about her from the text. You must explain using evidence from the text.

<u>Vocabulary</u>

- **stove** a piece of equipment that can burn fuel and is used for heating rooms
- **snout** projecting nose and mouth of an animal
- doll carriage doll's pram

2. Paragraph 2: Explain what we know about her from the argument with her father.
3. Paragraph 3: Explain what we know about her from the way she looks after Wilbur.
4. Paragraph 4: What do you think about Fern as a person? Is she extra ordinary in any way?
5. Use evidence from the text to explain your reasons for your descriptions of Fern.

<u>Vocabulary</u>


- hoghouse where the pigs live
