


Canonbury Year 6 SATs 2024 - above national average in all areas






2023/24 Reading, Writing & maths combined


Year 4 Multiplication Times-table Check 2024 - above national average








Year 1 Phonics Check 2024 - above national average

School Performance 2024

In standard assessments, Canonbury attainment was above the national average in all phases this year.

At Key Stage 2, Canonbury is in the top 23% of schools for achieving the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined.

In Year 1 Phonics, the number of children reaching the expected standard was 90%, which is 10% above the national average, while in the Year 4 MTC, Canonbury is in the top 9% nationally, with 90% of children scoring 21-25 out of 25.





Does your Employer offer a Corporate Match Funding Scheme?

Did you know that many companies offer their employees Matched Fund Schemes, whereby employers match money raised by a given charity.

As Canonbury Foundation is a registered charity, these schemes are an excellent way of raising additional money for our school. Our Christmas or Summer Fair is an ideal time to ask your HR department if they offer Matched Funding and a little bit of your time could raise double the funds for our school.

If you work for an organisation that has a Matched Funding Policy, any money you raise could be matched by your employer. Companies may match the fundraising total for an event, or for the stall that their employee is working on. Usually, the employee will need to supply them with a letter from the organisation detailing the date and nature of the event, together with the total raised.

We understand that the high street banks, building societies, supermarkets and large corporations are likely to do match funding, but these schemes are not exclusive to the major corporate giants. If you work for an independent company, they may be interested in charitable giving through match funding too.

We would be grateful if you could see if your employer has a Matched Funding Scheme, or if they are willing to match fund any of our events. - live in Islington
- pay rent
- · be in employment
- less than £50,000 gross household earnings
- Combined household of savings of less than £5,000

PROVIDE PROOF OF

- rent tenancy agreement of letter from landlord
- · savings- recent bank statements for every household member
- · earnings recent payslip for every household member

If you live in Islington, are claiming benefits and have a child aged 0-16 (or up to 18 with disabilities) who needs childcare, you may be entitled to a Childcare Bursary. The bursary is there to help parents who are starting work, a work placement, or short-term training to pay for childcare. It does not need to be paid back.
