Vocabulary:

- **deserted** – left alone or a place is empty of people
- **marvelled** – filled with wonder and astonishment
- **resided** – to live, have your home, or to stay in a place
- **illuminated** – to light something or make it brighter
- **flawless** – perfect or without any faults or mistakes
- **propped** – support or keep something in position
- **jutted** – to stick out or overhang beyond a surface
- **tentatively** – shows that you are not certain or confident
