## Phonics:

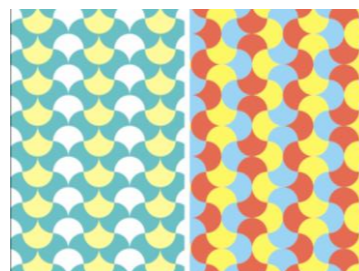
