

History and Geography



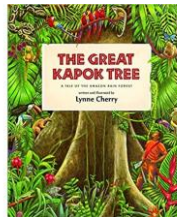
In **Geography**, we will be learning about the rainforest biome, linked with our Science topic of plants. We will use mapping skills to locate rainforest around the world and learn about the importance of these to humans and animals.

In **History**, we will be learning about the Ancient Maya, where they lived and their way of life.

English



Our main book this term is **The Great Kapok Tree** this explores the environmental issue of rainforest deforestation and its impact on animal and human life.

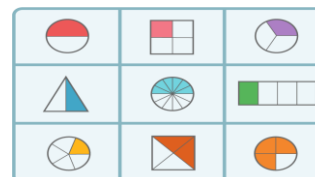
We will be using this to inspire creative story writing.

We will also be completing some persuasive writing linked to our History and Geography work giving the children a relevant purpose to their writing.

Maths

We will develop our understanding of new mathematical skills using the concrete, pictorial and abstract approach and developing our skills in reasoning and problem solving.

- **Fractions** – adding and subtracting fractions and reasoning problems.
- **Time** – telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes
- **Properties of shape** – describing 2D and 3D shapes and drawing lines accurately
- **Mass and capacity** – measuring and comparing mass, volume and capacity
- **Statistics** – interpreting graphs, charts and tables



Science

In our Topic on **plants** we will:



- Identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants: roots, stem/trunk, leaves and flowers
- Explore the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow) and how they vary from plant to plant
- Investigate the way in which water is transported within plants
- Explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.
