LO: To compare different forms of stimulus.

Task 2:

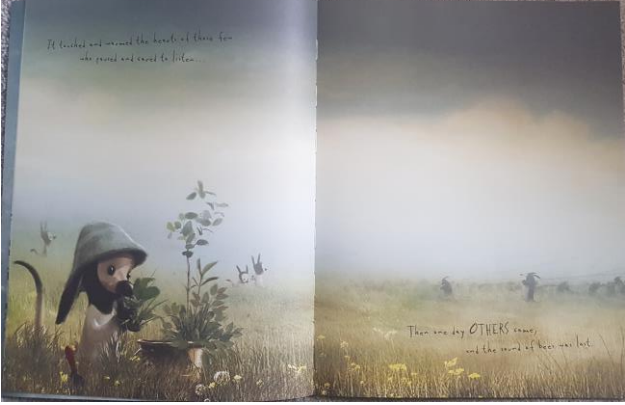

For this part of the task you will need an adult to help you for a few minutes.
