

## Week Commencing 18.05.20

LO: To identify a variety of living things in the local and wider environment

### **Task 1:**

We want you to search for any minibeasts you see in the next week. Keep your eye out for any minibeasts or animals. Fill in the table on the next page about the creature, and don't forget a picture or a sketch.

Sketching is an excellent way to learn about all the creatures' features!

If you are lucky enough to have a garden or an outside space, keep an eye out there!

Sometimes you may see creatures at home, maybe even pets. You can add them too if you stay at home.

If you are out of the house, remember to stay alert!

On the following page is a selection of pictures of minibeasts you can use if you are at home.

Remember:

- Look carefully for your minibeast, e.g. by moving logs or by using a stick to search through leaf litter. (Don't forget to put the logs back!)
- When you see a minibeast, gently scoop it into the pot with a spoon or brush.
- You can place a large white sheet under a tree and shake the branches to see what falls out.
- Don't forget to put the minibeasts back into a suitable habitat.

### **Task 2:**

#### **Make a minibeast**

Think of a minibeast they have found during your search. Create a ground picture of it using natural materials. Draw attention to the body parts of the minibeast and the number of legs it should have.

Can you find materials of the correct colours to make their picture from its habitat?

Think back to your colour work in art recently.

If you don't have outside materials, use materials from home.
